### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

- Remarks from Mr. Tim Marks with Opelousas General Health Systems regarding COVID-19 updates. Mr. Marks stated that Louisiana has seen a little over 139,500 cases and currently across the State 1,204 patients in the hospital with COVID and 187 of those on ventilators. In our region, we've seen close to 21,000 cases and parish wide, just under 3,000. In our parish, we are averaging around 300-350 tests a day and about 18 percent of those tests are coming back positive. At the hospital they have treated a total of 230 patients to date so far. Over the last 3 4 weeks, they are averaging 25 COVID patients a day. The turn-around time on testing has improved a lot. Typically, within 72 hours or less, they have results back. Drive-thru sites are open and the public can call 337-678-4705 to set up an appointment for testing. Cases are still at a plateau and flu season is right upon us. Mr. Wilbert Levier had concerns about the children returning to school. Mayor Pro-Tem Batiste and Mr. Marks confirmed that the schools would be providing virtual schooling for the students.

WHEREAS, the CITY entered into a Street Lighting Agreement with CENTRAL LOUISIANA ELECTRIC COMPANY, INC., (CLECO), effective May 14, 1991, under the terms of which CLECO is to provide street lights to the CITY. CLECO is obligated under the Agreement to replace any lights which are no longer operating;

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to upgrade the street lighting in certain areas of Opelousas which are located within the Opelousas Downtown Development District. The project requires the removal and replacement of approximately 150 street lights, where the existing lights will be replaced with 400-watt LED bulbs;

WHEREAS, the upgrades to the lighting system will serve to improve the safety of the citizens of Opelousas and will help in development of the downtown for business and residential purposes;

WHEREAS, ODDD has agreed to pay CLECO for the cost of the street lighting up to the sum of \$102,000.00;

WHEREAS, the participation of ODDD in this project will allow the CITY to complete the project within the shortest time period

THEREFORE, ODDD does hereby agree that it will contribute bunds to CLECO on behalf of the CITY for the cost of upgrading existing street lights located within the Downtown Development District, with the amount of funds to be contributed to be at the discretion of the ODDD Board of Commissioners, but not to exceed \$102,000.00.

**SECTION 1: CANCELLATION** 

This commitment will expire on December 31, 2020, unless extended or terminated by the ODDD Board of Commissioners.

**SECTION 2: EFFECTIVE DATE** 

This Agreement shall be effective July 29, 2020.

**SECTION 3: PURPOSE** 

The purpose of this Agreement is to further economic development within ODDD and within the City of Opelousas, and the Agreement shall be liberally construed to further that purpose. To that end, the Board of Commissioners of ODDD and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the CITY shall work together to promote the well-being of the citizens of Opelousas by making improvements to the street lighting.

**SECTION 4: PAYMENT** 

Payments to CLECO shall be made by ODDD within 30 days of receipt by ODDD of CLECO invoices for services rendered. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OPELOUSAS, PARISH OF ST. LANDRY AND STATE OF LOUISIANA: That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law as agreed upon by the following representatives of both parties:
