- Reading of Public Comments/Questions, if any. No public comments or questions were submitted regarding the agenda; however, the following members of the audience made announcements:
 - Mr. Eric Williams Mr. Williams is the founder of Guns Down, Power Up. He is interested in providing community prayer, community-based events and establishing a chess club to teach chess and conduct chess tournaments.
 - ❖ Ms. Lena Charles Ms. Charles, Opelousas Downtown Development District Chairwoman, stated that they will be conducting the third community Input meeting for Master Plan suggestions at the Courthouse Square on 02/27/2021 from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The public is invited to attend.
 - Mr. Jessie Bellard Mr. Bellard, acting Parish President, reminded the public that there will be a Special Election held on 03/20/2021 for election of Parish President. He stated that since he has been in office, he has restructured Parish Government; restructured the Parish Public Works division to have more Intergovernmental Agreements for use of equipment by the Municipalities so they can have more projects done on the Northside and Southside of town along with resurfacing of gravel roads; and restructured the Parish Airport. Mr. Bellard stated that he needs the support of the public to make things happen.
- COVID-19 Update from Opelousas General Health Systems (OGHS) representative. Mr. Ken Cochran, present CEO for the Opelousas General Health Systems (OGHS), stated that the COVID-19 numbers were improving. Currently they have treated 510 COVID positive in-patients and they have tested and treated 9,000 outpatients. The hospital is at capacity in the ICU and almost at capacity in the in-patient care unit for both COVID and non-COVID patients. Blood supply is at an all-time critical low—there will be a blood drive on 02/17/2021 at the main campus. The hospital has treated 121 out patients with antibody infusion treatment which is administered to mild to medium symptom patients. There are currently 2 vaccines available Pfizer and Maderna which are 2-dose vaccines. There is a 94-96% effectiveness 14 days after the second dose is administered. There have been about 3400 doses administered so far which includes a little over 2000 first doses and 1300 second doses. The hospital currently only has 10 COVID in-patients. For more information regarding scheduling an appointment to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, use the following link: https://bookoghs.timetap.com/
- Mr. Patrick Jenkins, St. Landry Parish School Superintendent, gave a brief overview of the schools over the course of last year. Pre-K students through 4th grade students returned full time in October. Seniors who wished to return to the classroom in-person returned last Wednesday. This Wednesday, the 5th grade students return to the classroom full time. As they get more information from the CDC, they are going to look at another round of students to return in person. Students who are utilizing satellite schooling have been provided with a laptop or device to use and the teachers have also been issued laptops. Sanitation procedures are being followed in the classrooms and on the school buses. On the academic front, they are experiencing many firsts. The school districts have received CARES Act funding and they have utilized about 80% of that funding. On the athletic front, of the 6 basketball teams, there are 5 teams expected to make the State Playoffs. The Opelousas High Boys Team is ranked 2nd in the State and the Opelousas High Girls Team is ranked 8th in the State. It is also time for Kindergarten Roundup—the theme this year is "Kindergarten Superheroes".
- Chief Martin McLendon addressed the Council to take into consideration the things that have happened throughout the City of Opelousas. He is deeply concerned that there is a crisis in law enforcement due to the violent crimes that are taking place in the City of Opelousas. Chief McLendon asked them to help him make the City safe. He stated that his department cooperated during the budget process and had their overtime budget slashed. He is requesting to raise the pay for the entry level police officers only to \$15.00 per hour and bump the PFC's up by 2% so they won't ever catch up to one another. He stated that he is not asking for a vote on a raise tonight but asking for a vote of confidence to ask Mr. Woods if they can afford this. He stated that they cannot keep officers if they continue to pay them \$13.00 an hour. This matter will be referred to the Budget Committee. No action taken at this time.
