ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OPELOUSAS, LOUISIANA, APPROVING AND ADOPTING A PLAN OF RE-APPORTIONMENT OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS OF THE CITY

WHEREAS La. R.S. 33:1371 requires that within one year after the official release of every decennial census, the governing authority of any municipality which contains two or more districts from which public officials are elected shall examine the apportionment plan of the municipal districts composing the municipal governing authority to determine if there exists any substantial variation in the representation of the districts; and

WHEREAS the Mayor and City Council of the City of Opelousas have engaged or caused to be engaged a professional consultant to assist in the review of the City's municipal districts; and

WHEREAS after review of the existing district boundaries and demographics related thereto, and after consideration of the advice and counsel of the re-districting consultant, the Mayor and City Council have determined that the municipal districts should be redrawn to make them more equitable; and

WHEREAS after considering several alternate re-apportionment plans, the City Council has determined that Plan 2 as one of the plans presented that is most equitable.

The foregoing considered:

BE IT ORDAINED that the boundaries of the municipal districts of the City of Opelousas be and are hereby redrawn in accordance with attached descriptions and map, hereby designated as Plan 2, which shall govern all future regularly scheduled elections public officials in the City of Opelousas; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that within ten (10) days of this date the redistricting plan as adopted herein shall be submitted to the Louisiana Secretary of State in a form as required by La. R.S. 18:1945; and


