- Presentations by Mayor Julius Alsandor: Mayor Alsandor relinquished his time to Ms. Lena Charles, chairperson of the Opelousas Downtown Development District (ODDD) who gave an update on the status of projects. She pointed out that ODDD and the City of Opelousas have partnered and are working on several things, along with the City Engineer, William Jarrell, specifically infrastructure and things behind the scene that make the things that you're going to see pretty soon happen. Ms. Charles stated that ODDD adopted a lot of items on their goals for 2022 and these are a few of them that are coming to fruition very soon: * Clean City Policy - they are working on a plan to get everyone involved from neighborhood to neighborhood and taking initiative about getting this city cleaned up first and maintaining that initiative. ODDD applied for a small grant through the Keep Louisiana Beautiful and Louisiana Clean the Boot projects and they received it and although it was a very small grant, it was a catalyst for them to start the Clean Cities program. Ms. Charles also recognized Mrs. Melanie Lebouef with the City Tourism department who collaborates with them on getting an understanding of where they can go after grants especially in state grants. * Tab Grant – this grant was issued in 2014 and 2018 as an initiative and they thought they could actually get it done within a year but they are still working on it because they are still having challenges. * Streetscape - they have an area around Courthouse Square—a block from Landry Street from Court to Market and Market to court which is going to be their Showcase of Streetscape. * Wayfinding - when you go to a municipality, you need to know what street to turn on for the courthouse, city hall, etc., with signage. * Downtown Buildings not in use - the city needs help addressing this situation so the ODDD decided to engage a separate firm to review property to see what we have on the books to see if there's a violation and those reviews will result in recommendations which will be brought before the administration and council to see how we can change some of these laws to put some teeth to move where we want to go. This firm is at no cost to the City. * Billy's is clearing a lot of property and a portion of that is going to be for Billy's and a portion is going to be for sale to someone else. * Utility services – ODDD is bringing water and sewerage and wastewater services on the west side of Wallior to the east side of Wallior so the developing properties would have access to water as it is being developed. * Zydeco Festival - the 40th Annual Zydeco Festive will be live this year beginning with the September 3rd kickoff dance and parade at the Courthouse Square. Information will be available on the website in a few days and they will have their unveiling on August 24th at the Opelousas City Museum.

ORDINANCE NO. 05 OF 2022

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 15 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES (ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1967) AND ADOPTING A NAME CHANGE TO THE OPELOUSAS-EUNICE LIBRARY

WHEREAS, Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinances was enacted in 1967 by Ordinance No. 5, Section 1 of 1967, which established a joint agreement with the Town of Eunice to promote, maintain, support, and operate a public library known as the Opelousas-Eunice Public Library;

WHEREAS, the Town of Eunice and City of Opelousas had operated the Opelousas-Eunice Public Library for a period in excess of fifty (50) years;

WHEREAS, sometime in or around July 2019, however, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Eunice approved a separation of the Opelousas-Eunice Library that resulted in each municipality operating an independent library;

WHEREAS, since that time the City of Opelousas has solely operated the library at 212 E. Grolee Street;
