Recognition of Business Improvement Grants Award Recipients.

Building Improvement Grants Awarded to Six Businesses in Opelousas

(Opelousas, LA) -Six business owners will share in \$20-thousand dollars in grant funding for the 2022 Building Improvement Grant (BIG) cycle. Funded by the Opelousas Downtown Development District, the grants will assist business and property owners with repairs and improvements to their buildings. Some of the work for this year's projects include façade maintenance and repairs related to roof and window repair, installing gutters, floor restoration, interior work and painting. The Building Improvement Grants is a collaborative effort by the City of Opelousas, Opelousas Downtown Development District (ODDD) and Opelousas Main Street, Inc. "On behalf of the City of Opelousas, we are thankful to the Opelousas Downtown Development District for support with this valuable program and their commitment to improving the downtown district," said Opelousas Mayor Julius Alsandor. "These enhancement projects will bring positive changes to small businesses and our community."

Launched in 2021, the program was established to support and encourage business and property owners to reinvest in their buildings. The grant provides matching funds to help restore or beautify storefronts in the Opelousas Downtown Development District corridor. Both the Opelousas Main Street district and Historic District are included in the corridor. The first grant cycle, which allocated \$10,000 in grant funding to five local businesses, and leveraged over \$100,000 of private investment. Expanding on the success of the first grant cycle, \$20-thousand dollars in funding was available for the second round of funding with a maximum grant

allowance of \$5,000 per applicant. Grant recipients were selected from applications submitted in July.

"We are excited to work with our downtown businesses to distribute grant funds that have a positive impact on Opelousas," said Lena Charles, Chairman of the Downtown District. "Improving buildings on our downtown corridors will help with revitalization efforts for Opelousas."

The Opelousas Downtown Development District also collaborated with city staff to help administer the program. "There's a considerable need for façade

improvement funding so this grant is really important in providing some relief to property and business owners," said Melanie LeBouef, Opelousas Main Street

 - Poetics of Selfhood / Poétique de l'Ipséité explores variations on Creole and Francophone identities as expressed through the work of a group of contemporary artists. This project is envisioned as a multi-year, multi-destination exhibition, which will grow and adapt to new contexts of the Creole world as it is re-mounted at new destinations across the French-speaking world. The first iteration of this exhibition takes place at Acadiana Center for the Arts, Lafayette, LA, from September 10. 2022 to February 14. 2023. This exhibition aims to expand the understanding of Creole identity as a worldwide cultural identity—"Creolite"—which has a well-developed place in contemporary culture through visual art, performance, and personal expression. The focus of this exhibition is the work of five artists who deal with notions of Créolité in the subject matter of their works, Gwladys Gambie (Martinique), Rebecca D. Henry (USA), Jérémie Priam (Martinique), Tabita Rezaire (Guyana), and Modou Dieng Yacine (USA/Senegal). These artists work within a variety of media, ranging from traditional media like painting and quilt making, to digital and experimental media and social practices. The exhibition will focus on the interconnected 'conversation' between their practices and the world-views they represent. The Louisiana artist highlighted in this project is Rebecca D. Henry from Opelousas, Louisiana. A Creole folklorist and a specialist in folk medicine traditions, Henry is the founder of the Creole Heritage Folklife Center in Opelousas. Louisiana, where for the past 30 years she has dedicated her life to preserving the Creole traditions of her home. Henry was born in 1941 and grew up a sharecropper's daughter, where she spent her youth picking cotton in the fields with her brothers and sisters.

The parish just received clearance to clean up blighted property and place the bill on the property owner's tax bill. Paul Gennuso agreed that there is a big problem with drainage but pointed out that Bayou Yarbor has ways to get in and out of those canals and the City does have equipment to handle this. Mayor Alsandor also pointed out that the canals are being sprayed every year however, the City does not have the manpower right now.

The city shall have the right to cause the removal of any dead or diseased trees on private property within the city, when such trees constitute a hazard to life and property, or harbor insects or disease which constitute a potential threat to other trees within the city. The City Tree Board will notify in writing the owners of such trees. Removal shall be done by said owners at their own expense within 60 days after the date of service of notice. In the event of failure of owners to comply with such provisions, the city shall have the authority to remove such trees and charge the cost of removal on the owner's property tax notice.

WHEREAS, there has not been a city tree board for many years, and it remains necessary from time to time for the city to address dead or diseased trees on private property that constitute hazards to life and property;

WHEREAS, city administration believes it necessary and advisable to vest authority in the city attorney to provide the notice referenced in

Section 15 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1993;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance amending Section 15 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1993 was introduced by council members Milton Batiste III and Sherell Roberts at a public meeting on September 13, 2022, and notice of a public hearing on the proposed Ordinance was published in the Opelousas Daily World;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on the Ordinance on October 11, 2022, and thereafter on motion of councilmember and seconded by councilmember _, the Ordinance was offered for adoption, and the following vote was recorded:

Section 15 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1993 is hereby amended so that it reads in its entirety as follows:

The city shall have the right to cause the removal of any dead or diseased trees on private property within the city, when such trees constitute a hazard to life and property, or harbor insects or disease which constitute a potential threat to other trees within the city. The City Attorney will notify in writing the owners of such trees. Removal shall be done by said owners at their own expense within 60 days after the date of service of notice. In the event of failure of owners to comply with such provisions, the city shall have the authority to remove such trees and charge the cost of removal on the owner's property tax notice.
